Personal Multimedia Essay

Assignment Summary

For your first digital project, you will write a multimedia essay about your past experiences that you will add to your ePortfolio. Your multimedia essay should reflect on your past. You can choose a prompt below to get you started or write on any topic that includes reflection on your past experiences.

What is a multimedia essay?

A multimedia essay uses multimedia, including text, image, video, and audio, to tell a complex story. The pieces interweave to inform one another. Since this is your first essay, I only require images, but you may add other media forms if you choose. You can share photos, do your own artwork, or curate a selection of images online. You will post your finished essay to your ePortfolio (be sure to include it in the course menu!). Our work on the essay in this class is also helpful practice for your multimedia essay in your research team.

Objectives

To learn how to craft a multimedia essay in which image and text mutually inform one another and add greater depth to your work, to find your voice as a writer, and practice storytelling with detail and meaning.

Sample prompts

- Write about a time you questioned a commonly held belief or practice. Describe the belief or practice. What first made you doubtful? What consequences did you fear would result from choosing to go against the norm? How did you respond to your doubts? How has questioning the belief or practice affected your life? If you talked through your skepticism with others, how did they react? Did you decide to act differently, or did you continue as you had before? Are you glad you decided to ask these questions, or have they resulted in changes you wish had never occurred? Share images that help us understand your life at the time, the belief or practice, or your emotions surrounding the issue.
- Make a list of places that have been influential for you. They can be any size—a city, a neighborhood, a bench in a park or a room in your house. They can be anywhere you like—places you've lived, places you've visited, or where you are now! Write about each place. Who was your community there? How did your experience there shape you? Choose images that represent a feeling or memory about each place. Write captions that explain the significance of the pictures for someone who's never been there.
- Reflect upon a part of your identity that is important to you. Choose images that explain why this makes you who you are. Tell stories that show how this aspect of identity defines you or times where it was tested or refined.

Assignment Guidelines

- Essay is 1,000-1,500 words and includes a compelling title.
- Include 5-7 images or other media. These can be from your childhood, your own artwork, or found online. Choose at least two images for their composition, environment, etc.
- Consider how you use text and image together. Choose the location for images in the essay carefully, talk about them in the text, and **caption them**.
- Show how your thoughts and ideas about yourself and the world developed.
- Refine your style and strike a tone. How do you want to represent yourself to an audience?
- Think about how you move from point to point. What ideas belong together? What words most creatively and precisely convey your story?
- If you search for images online, make sure you have the licensing to share them. The “tools” feature in Google Images allows you to narrow your search to images with a Creative Commons license. As an SIUE student, you have access to Adobe Stock; create an account through Creative Cloud using your Microsoft login. Any images that are not your own, should be cited with appropriate permissions in the caption.
