- 3) 1-2 slides explaining the content, purpose, and dissemination of each group member's group project *Emplace* contribution
- 4) 1 slide featuring each the content, purpose, and (potential) dissemination of each group member's blast-from-the-past *Emplace* contribution
- 5) Reflections on your experiences in CODES (either one slide or distributed throughout)

## A Note on Style and Presentation

Though we encourage and appreciate your creativity, we also have certain stylistic standards we would like you to meet, including:

- Use 20pt font or greater
- Ensure the contrast between text and background is strong for readability (e.g., don't use white font on a light purple background)
- Minimize text—any text should be bullet point ideas, not paragraphs!
- During the presentation itself, do not read directly from the slides. Prepare notecards, and practice your presentation multiple times so that you are prepared on the day of!
